**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2003**

Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The accounting policies of Saint Tammany Drainage Parish District No. 2 ("District") conform to generally accepted accounting principles prescribed by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. These accounting principles are required by state law for political subdivisions as stated in the Louisiana Governmental Audit Guide.

Basis of Presentation – Fund Accounting

The accounts of the District are organized on the basis of funds or account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The various funds are summarized by type in the financial statements. The District uses the following fund types and account groups:

Governmental Fund Types – Special Revenue Fund – Used to account for the proceeds of specific revenue sources that are legally restricted to expenditures for specified purposes.

Account Group – General Fixed Assets Account Group – Used to account for all fixed assets of the District.

Basis of Accounting

The accounting and financial reporting treatment applied to a fund is determined by its measurement focus. All governmental fund types are accounted for using a current financial resources measurement focus. With this measurement focus, only current assets and current liabilities generally are included on the balance sheet. Operating statements of these funds present increases and decreases in net current assets.

The governmental fund types follow the modified accrual basis of accounting. Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recorded when susceptible to accrual, i.e., both measurable and available. Available means collectible within the current period or soon enough thereafter to be used to pay liabilities of the current period. Expenditures are recorded when the related fund liability is incurred, if measurable.

Note 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting - continued

Revenues from local sources consist primarily of property taxes. Property tax revenues are recognized when susceptible to accrual or assessed. Interest is recorded when received.

Reporting Entity

In accordance with R.S. 1674.15, St. Tammany Parish Drainage District No. 2 was created and given authority to accept and approve any and all drainage facilities constructed at the expense of landowners within the assessment area and donation thereof. According to R.S. 1608, the Saint Tammany Parish Government is to appoint five commissioners, who shall constitute the governing authority of the District. The commissioners will oversee the operations and maintenance of levees and drainage in district number two as well as upkeep and maintenance of the drainage facilities. In order to accomplish the operations of the district, the commissioners may impose annually an average tax.

General Fixed Assets

Equipment is stated on the basis of historical cost. Major fixed asset additions are paid for by property taxes. In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, no provision is made for depreciation of such assets in the General Fixed Assets Account Group. There are no additions or retirements for the year ending December 31, 2002.

Budget

The District is subject to the Local Government Budget Act. All appropriations, which are not expended, lapse at year-end.

Note 2. Cash

The District's funds are deposited into an impounded checking account that earns interest. The funds are insured in accordance with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$ 100,000.00.

Note 3. Donation

A ten thousand dollar donation was recorded in the year 2002. The donation was used to defray the costs associated with the two hurricanes that occurred in the year 2002.

Note 4. Total Columns on Combined Statements

Total columns on the Combined Statements are captioned " Total (Memo Only) " to indicate that they are presented only to facilitate financial analysis. Data in these columns do not present financial position, results of operations, or changes in financial position in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES**

I have performed the procedures included in the Louisiana Government Audit Guide and enumerated below, which were agreed to by the management of St. Tammany Parish Drainage District No. 2 and the Legislative Auditor, State of Louisiana, solely to assist the users in evaluating management's assertions about St. Tammany Parish Drainage District No. 2's compliance with certain laws and regulations during the year ended December 31, 2002 included in the accompanying Louisiana Attestation Questionnaire. This agreed-upon procedures engagement was performed in accordance with standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of the specified users of the report. Consequently, I make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Public Bid Law

1. Select all expenditures made during the year for material and supplies exceeding \$15,000, or public works exceeding \$100,000, and determine whether such purchases were made in accordance with LSA-RLS 38:2211-2251 (the public bid law).

There were no expenditures let for material and supplies exceeding \$ 15,000. There were no public works let in the year 2002 exceeding \$ 100,000.

Code of Ethics for Public Officials and Public Employees

1. Obtain from management a list of the immediate family members of each board member as defined by LSA-RLS 42:1101-1134 (the code of ethics), and a list of outside business interests of all board members and employees, as well as their immediate families.

Management provided us with the required list.

1. Obtain from management a listing of all employees paid during the period under examination.

No employees in 2002.

4. Determine whether any of those employees included in the listing obtained from management in agreed-upon procedure (3) were also included on the listing obtained from management in agreed-upon procedure (2) as immediate family members.

Budgeting

5. Obtain a copy of the legally adopted budget and all amendments.

Management provided us with a copy of the budget.

6. Trace the budget adoption and amendments to the minute book.

I was able to trace formal adoption of the budget for 2002 to the minutes, and there were no amendments to the Budget.

7. Compare the revenues and expenditures of the final budget to actual revenues and expenditures to determine if actual revenues failed to meet budgeted revenues by 3% or more or if actual expenditures exceed budgeted amounts by 3% or more.

In comparing actual revenues and expenditures to budgeted amounts, I found actual expenditures did exceed total budgeted expenditures by more than 3%. Revenues on a GAAP basis exceeded non-GAAP budgetary basis by more than 3%. Actual expenditures exceeded budgetary expenditures due to the two hurricanes that occurred in the year 2002.

Accounting and Reporting

8. Randomly select 6 disbursements made during the period under examination and:

- a) Trace payments to supporting documentation as to proper amount and payee.

I examined supporting documentation for each of selected disbursements and found that payment was for the correct amount and to the correct payee.

- b) Determine if payments were properly coded to the correct fund and general ledger account; and

The payments were properly coded to correct fund and general ledger accounts.

- c) Determine whether payments received approval from proper authorities.

All payments, received approval as evidenced in minutes.

Meetings

9. Examine evidence indicating that agendas for meetings recorded in the minute book were posted or advertised as required by LSA-RS 42:1 through 42:12 (the open meetings law)

St. Tammany Parish Drainage District No. 2 is only required to post a notice of each meeting and the accompanying agenda at the building in which the meeting is held.

Management asserted that notices were properly posted; I did not observe evidence of such. However, meeting notices and agendas were found in the minute file.

Debt

10. Examine bank deposits for the period under examination and determine whether any such deposits appear to be proceeds of bank loans, bonds, or like indebtedness.

I inspected copies of all bank deposits for the period under examination and noted no deposits, which appeared to be proceeds of bank loans, bonds, or like indebtedness. However, a donation was made by a landowner to help with the costs of two hurricanes and the prolonged running of the pump station.

Advances and Bonuses

11. Examine payroll records and minutes for the year to determine whether any payments have been made to employees, which may constitute bonuses, advances, or gifts.

No employees. The minutes did not approve of any such payment.

I was not engaged to, and did not, perform an examination, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion on management's assertions. Accordingly, I do not express such an opinion. Had I performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to my attention that would have been reported to you.

This report is intended solely for the use of management of St. Tammany Parish Drainage District No. 2 and the Legislative Auditor, State of Louisiana, and should not be used by those who have not agreed to the procedures and taken responsibility for the sufficiency of the procedures for their purposes.
